ASB Community Trust supports organisations that respond to needs identified by our communities, with a focus on innovative programmes that address the underlying causes of social problems.

Operating Support

The Trust will consider funding for community organisations which are responding to the needs of our communities and working to address the underlying causes of social problems. Funding of up to 10 % of total annual expenditure (based on the latest audited accounts) will be considered.

Funding will be considered for costs relating to:

- Operating costs
- Equipment
- Website
- Volunteer costs
- Programme costs

Please note that organisations that have annual expenditure of \$500,000 or over will only be eligible for a grant of up to \$50,000.

The assessment of applications will take the following criteria into consideration:

- Fit with the Trust's strategic objectives and priorities
- Collaboration and partnerships with other groups to improve outcomes
- Demonstrate need
- Capacity to deliver
- A focus on innovation and prevention
- That the grant will help develop or strengthen good practice.

Minor Building Projects

The Trust will consider funding minor building projects for social service providers, up to a maximum of \$50,000.

Funding will be considered for costs relating to:

- Building maintenance and upgrades relating to health and safety issues
- Building modifications.

Assessment criteria

Funding requests will be assessed against these criteria:

- Fit with the Trust's strategic objectives and priorities
- Evidence that the project will enhance the organisation's capacity to deliver services/programmes
- Evidence the project will enhance and enable collaboration through sharing of resources and/or community space
- Organisation must own the facility, or hold a long-term lease
- Funding can only be applied for every three years.

- A copy of your certificate of title or lease agreement
- A quote for the work you are applying to the Trust for
- A list of social services and programmes provided by your organisation.
