Community Building Projects

ASB Community Trust aims to support capital building projects where there is strong community involvement, or where the project has regional significance.

If you are requesting \$50,000 or more towards a capital building project, please read through this information and then contact us for more details.

If your request is for less than \$50,000, you need to apply under the relevant funding sector for your organisation (eg Recreation & Sport, Arts & Culture, etc). Visit our website for more information.

If you are applying for a marae development or heritage building project (regardless of the level of funding), you can apply under those sectors.

The Trust does not fund retrospectively.

Community Building Projects requests will be considered under the following areas:

Collaboration and Community Engagement

We will consider grants for community building projects that support strong community involvement, so participation in community activities and social interaction improves.

Grants will be considered for costs relating to:

- Costs of building a new facility that serves as a meeting place for a large number of people/organisations
- Building renovations / building modifications
- Building expansions or upgrades to increase capacity, or extend services to the community.

Regional Infrastructure

The Trust will consider grants for capital building projects that are regionally significant and of a public nature.

Grants will be considered for costs relating to:

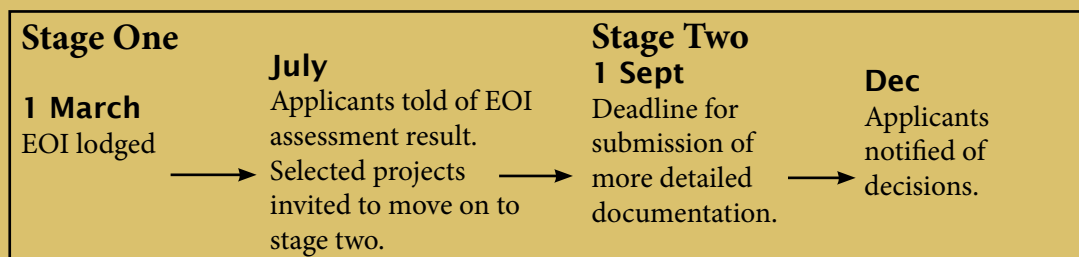
- Development of new public places or buildings
- Renovations, modifications, expansions, or upgrades to public places, buildings and facilities which will increase the capacity of, or extend services to, the community.

Two Stage Assessment Process

Community Building Projects are expected to have strong project management and proof of community need.

The sector has a two stage assessment process. The first stage is to submit an expression of interest (EOI), along with a one-page project description, which should include a concept drawing, if appropriate. If this is approved, you will be invited to submit more detailed documentation before the 1 September deadline. This documentation will include:

- A feasibility study/needs analysis identifying community need for the project
- A comprehensive project plan, including: project timeline; building and resource consents; quantity survey report, etc
- Detailed project costings.
