Health – what we fund

ASB Community Trust supports and strengthens community organisations that improve health outcomes for the people of our region, by focusing on health promotion and preventative projects

Community Health

The Trust will consider general funding for community organisations which work in the areas of health promotion and prevention.

Grants will be considered for up to a maximum 10% of an organisation's annual expenses (based on your last audited accounts), up to a maximum of \$50,000.

This can be used for:

- Operating costs
- Office furniture and equipment
- IT equipment and upgrades
- Resources

The assessment of applications will take the following criteria into consideration:

- Fit with the Trust's strategic objective - community organisations that work in the area of health promotion and prevention.
- Organisational capacity – organisation that can deliver ongoing programmes and services.

Priority will be given to organisations that demonstrate:

- Collaboration - organisations that are working with others to improve health outcomes through health promotion and prevention.
- A commitment to reducing disparity – organisations which are working with communities to improve access to health care services with the aim of improving health outcomes and

Minor Building Projects

The Trust will consider funding for minor building projects (up to a maximum of \$50,000) for community organisations working in the area of health promotion and prevention

Grants will be considered for costs relating to:

- Building maintenance and upgrades.
- Building modifications relating to health and safety issues.

Groups can apply for this funding once every three years.

Applications will be assessed against the following criteria:

- That the project will enhance the organisation's capacity to deliver health promotion and prevention services and programmes.
- Community use must be demonstrated.
- Organisation must own the facility, or hold a long-term lease.

What we don't fund

The Trust does not fund items or areas that are funded by the Ministry of Health and other government agencies.

Other areas the Trust does not fund include:

- Operating and upgrade costs for hospices
- Medical equipment
- Salaries of core health professionals
- Primary health organisations (PHOs)
- District health boards (DHBs)
- Hospitals and clinics
- Core primary healthcare
- Health research
- Staff vehicles
